



Masters "Spoon River Anthology" was published in 1915. Each poem in the anthology is an epitaph that tells the reader something about daily life in the fictional Illinois town of Spoon River.

Each of the 2 34 epitaph poems reveals something 20th century small town American life, replete with pieces of cossip, local legends and even slander.




